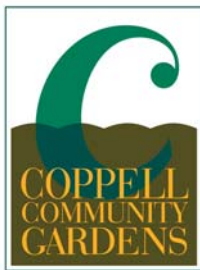




Coppell Community Garden 2011 Adopt-a-Plot Agreement

Terms of Agreement for Adopt-a-Plot and Share the Harvest:

1. The Coppell Community Garden/City of Coppell will provide the garden plot, water, access to tools, mulch, compost, amendments, and gardening information. A selection of seeds and some transplants will be provided for a nominal cost, when available.
2. Gardeners will:
 - a. Plant their plot with fruits and vegetables throughout the growing season, March through October. Year round gardening is encouraged.
 - b. Water as necessary.
 - c. Weed their plot AND the walkway around their plot.
 - d. Learn and use only organic gardening methods.
 - e. Harvest their produce.
 - f. Donate the majority of their produce to the Metrocrest food pantry.
 - g. Participate in the assigned community chores necessary to maintain the garden.
 - h. Complete a background form and return it to the City of Coppell.
3. Harvest and donate the MAJORITY of your weekly produce for the Saturday 10:00 AM food pantry pick-up. If you are not available to do it, arrange for another gardener to do it or inform the garden leader.
4. If, for any reason (health, issues, work), you cannot maintain your plot or have a grievance with others, inform your garden leader after taking steps to resolve it yourself.
5. Each new gardener will pay a one-time \$10 processing fee to the Coppell Community Garden when they are assigned their plot.
6. Available plots shall be given to new gardeners before being given to an existing gardener. New gardeners will start with one plot their first year. The maximum allowance of garden plots by one family or group is two plots or the number of plots you ended with the prior year.
7. The Coppell Community Garden Chair and designated leaders at each garden oversee the gardens. The garden leaders will assign plots, assist new gardeners, report maintenance issues, check supplies, ensure community chores are being done, check garden plots for compliance with agreement terms and be available to resolve problems. The garden leader meetings are open to all gardeners.
8. Gardeners must adhere to the terms stated above to continue to garden their adopted plot(s). The garden leader will contact the gardener of a grievance and work to resolve it within a specified time. If the grievance remains, then the garden leader and Garden Chair may revoke the plot assignment.
